

# Vocabulary

## muted

**Meaning:** Soft or not bright in color; gentle in tone.

**Examples:**

1. She wore a muted blue shirt today.
2. The walls were painted in muted colors.

## very rare

**Meaning:** Not common; happening only sometimes.

**Examples:**

1. It is very rare to see her wearing yellow.
2. Snow is very rare in this area.

## wardrobe

**Meaning:** The collection of clothes that people wear.

**Examples:**

1. You won't find the color yellow in my wardrobe.
2. She spends a lot of money on her wardrobe.

## captivating

**Meaning:** Very interesting or beautiful in a way that holds your attention.

**Examples:**

1. Yellow is a bright and captivating color.
2. The movie was so captivating that I watched it twice.

## it suits

**Meaning:** Looks good on someone; matches their appearance or style.

## Examples:

1. I feel like blue suits my skin tone well.
2. That dress really suits you.

## I feel like

**Meaning:** I think or believe; used to express a personal opinion or feeling.

## Examples:

1. I feel like blue looks very good on me.
2. I feel like today is going to be a great day.
