charity organizations

Meaning: Groups that help others using donations and volunteer work.

Examples:

1. Many charity organizations provide food and shelter after disasters.
2. He works for one of the largest charity organizations in the world.

beneficial to humankind

Meaning: Helpful or good for people in general.

Examples:

1. Clean energy is beneficial to humankind.
2. The new vaccine is beneficial to humankind.

undoubtedly

Meaning: Certainly; without a doubt.

Examples:

1. Charities have undoubtedly saved lives.
2. She is undoubtedly a great leader.

if not

Meaning: Possibly more than what was just mentioned.

Examples:

1. They helped millions, if not hundreds of millions.
2. This might take days, if not weeks.

the big work

Meaning: The most important or difficult tasks in society.

Examples:

1. Charities can't do the big work alone.
2. Governments must handle the big work.

structured in a way that

Meaning: Designed or organized to function in a specific manner.

Examples:

1. The system should be structured in a way that helps everyone.
2. The course is structured in a way that supports beginners.

temporary solution

Meaning: A short-term fix to a problem.

Examples:

1. Charity is a temporary solution to poverty.
2. We need more than a temporary solution for housing.

permanent problems

Meaning: Issues that last a long time or are ongoing.

Examples:

1. Hunger and inequality are permanent problems.
2. Education can solve some permanent problems.

admirable

Meaning: Deserving respect or praise.

Examples:

1. Their work helping others is admirable.
2. Starting a charity is an admirable effort.

funnel

Meaning: To send or direct something (money, energy, etc.) toward a specific place.

Examples:

1. They funnel donations into health programs.
2. The charity funneled funds to flood victims.

effective

Meaning: Producing the desired result or outcome.

Examples:

1. The program is very effective at reducing hunger.
2. That charity is effective because it focuses on education.
